AGM Report 2017**

It was another busy year for officials in Ontario. Our current membership is 173 up from 153 in 2016.

Once again, our officials set a high standard of officiating at all Athletic Ontario championship events. Having the Canadian Championships in Ottawa allowed us the opportunity to have 54 Ontario officials work at the meet. In addition, our officials stepped up to contribute to the success of the North American Indigenous Games, the World Dwarf Championships, the NACAC Masters Championships, and the Invictus Games.

We were able to procure invitations to several out-of-province events.

The AOOEC and sub-committees of the AOOEC met on several conference calls since last year's AGM.

2017 was a very busy year as I spend a great deal of time assisting with coordinating officials for the Canadian Championships, the World Dwarf Games, and the Invictus Games.

I attended the annual AC/NOC meeting in December 2016 in Ottawa. There has been some progress with communications and projects by NOC. Hopefully with the new chair Andy Walker from PEI, the committee will return the leadership of our officials to the standard that was set in the past. We were pleased to hear that Ontario will again have representation on the committee as Helen Vasilic was recently named to fill a vacancy. This year the annual meeting of NOC and the branch chairs will be in Winnipeg on November 30, 2017.

In January, I attended a Multi-Sport Think Tank in Vaughan with officials from various sports. It was interesting to note that for the most part officials from other sports have many of the same concerns as track & field officials.

For 2018 our main goal again will be to concentrate on providing officiating and upgrading opportunities for all Ontario officials.
