Overview

Quest for Gold – Ontario Athlete Assistance Program 2021-2022 (OAAP) is funded by the Government of Ontario, through the Ministry of Heritage, Sport, Tourism and Culture Industries (MHSTCI). The overarching goal of the Quest for Gold – OAAP is directly related to the High Performance Sport goal of the Canadian Sport Policy – that Canadians are systematically achieving world-class results at the highest levels of international competition – by improving the performance and number of Ontario athletes performing at the national and international level, thereby contributing to the improved performance of Canada at international competitions.

Committee Meetings

With the short timelines provided by the Ministry, most of the communication within the committee is done via email.

Summary

The draft criteria for 2021-2022 was posted in April of 2022. The final criteria was delayed due to Ministry delays pertaining to COVID-19. The ministry modified the Quest to Gold Program to enable funding for direct-to-athlete funding, athlete travel and supporting coaches travel funding. A total of \$226,172 in funding was provided to athletes and supporting coaches.

Eighty-two (82) athletes received Quest for Gold direct-to-athlete and travel funding in the 2021-2022 cycle. In addition 7 supporting coaches received Quest for Gold travel funding

Direct-to-athlete carding were broken down as follows:

- 50 Full Cards
- 17 Para Cards
- 15 Half Cards

Issues

As in the past couple of years final criteria was delayed due to COVID-19. This resulted in a very quick turnaround for criteria development, applications, evaluations, etc.
